# **Uniform Survey**

Thank you to all families who responded to our uniform survey. It was wonderful to have so much parental input. Please find results below.


- As per the results, we will move to the **FULL** school crested tracksuit 5 days a week, beginning in September 2024 for all classes in the school.
- This will consist of a crested school tracksuit jumper, grey polo shirt, dark, unbranded navy trousers and runners. All items are available to buy in Sweetnam's Drapery Store in Carrick or alternatively, you can source your own items, so long as they are uniform compliant and buy a crest from the school office.
- ❖ The slight majority of 5 votes, I feel would be unfair to change to an entirely different school tracksuit. We can revisit this is the future.
- ❖ 100% of respondents committed to changing to a tracksuit daily, this can only be a long term decision, if all families continue to commit to this. It is an essential part of school life, that the children have pride in their uniform and pride in their school. The new arrangements will be phased in over the course of the 2024/2025 school year to alleviate costs on parents as I am aware that many homes have uniforms from past pupils that can be used. We will then move to the new school tracksuit only from September 2025.

### **Homework**

As you are all aware, we did not have any written homework for the first half term. This was to emphasise the importance of reading, oral work and learning homework. As a staff, we recognise that homework is an important home school link and yet we recognise that modern families lead busy lives. We would like to continue to place an emphasis on the fundamentals of reading, spellings and tables which the children will have each evening, as well as some oral learning work. The children from 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> Class, will receive a maximum of 3 short written pieces of homework, for completion **over the week**, this allows us to continue to link with home. We hope that homework can be a more positive and meaningful part of your day. We urge you to engage with your child's reading each evening. Infant homework will continue in the same format.

We are currently reviewing our spelling programme in the school and further guidance on this will issue early next week.

## **Boys Football**

Our boys have represented our school with such wonderful distinction over the course of their Cumann na mBunscoil pool games. They began their league with wins against Inniskeen and Scoil Rois, which were two fantastic performances.
